

CELEBRATING SIWKW (spring)

It's finally that time where Siwkw, spring, is here on the land. March 20th (6:01am) is the official spring equinox this year and we are looking to find ways to celebrate as a community.

Activities: There will be ceremonial fires in the evening times, and the cookhouse will be available for games, storytelling, and sharing of food. This is a community-oriented event and people

are welcome to bring their cultural medicines and gifts (drumming, dancing, storytelling, etc). And if you would like to offer a workshop related to spring or nature, please let shalan know and we'll post that information to update community.

Games: Waltes and Mi'kmaw language-based games will be available in the cookhouse.

Storytelling: Come bring your favourite story to share! Think of your big fish stories! (There might be a prize for audience choice of "best story" on our first evening!)





Fire: There is a provincial fire ban that began March 15th. Fires are restricted during the daytime. Pending our zone being in green or yellow each day, we will be relighting a ceremonial fire for the evenings, but there will always be smudge available in the wi'kuom during the day for people to give offerings and be in ceremony.

<u>We will need fire keepers</u> during the evenings to take care of the ceremonial fire in the wi'kuom. There will be a sign-up in the cookhouse. Wela'lioq!

Giveaway Blanket: We welcome anyone who wishes to participate in the giveaway to bring a small gift to share (eg. can be a jar of food you canned, something you made, etc). Everyone will place a small item on the blanket and when we're ready, each taking a turn around the circle each participant will pick up an item from the blanket. This gift exchange is a great way to share what you might have extras of, and be able to accept an offering from someone else in the community.

Language: Come join us and practice what you know, and also learn new words and phrases in our language! Beginners of all stages are welcome!
