Job Summary

The Mi'kmaw Environmental and Cultural Heritage Monitor observes the environmental and cultural heritage landscape within NS Power capital project construction activities for potential impacts. Provide detailed reporting to the Mi'kmaq and NS Power regarding potential environmental and cultural concerns to address throughout construction.

Main Duties

- Understand the Mi'kmaq areas of interest and use of sites of a cultural, spiritual or historical nature.
- Read maps and navigate variable terrain.
- Observe and provide weekly reports regarding construction activities on site; any environmental and cultural concerns to the Mi'kmaq, KMKNO and NS Power.
- Communicate effectively with Project team members.
- Follow NS Power Project site Occupational Health and Safety protocols including onsite Safety Orientation, regular toolbox, and weekly meetings.

Working Conditions

The Mi'kmaw Environmental and Cultural Heritage Monitor work will be conducted primarily in the field observing construction activities. Travel to and from the field will be a requirement in performing roles and responsibilities associated with the position.

- Working in an outdoor environment.
- Traveling in irregular weather conditions and being exposed to wildlife.
- Walking long distances over rough terrain

- Wearing specialized safety equipment that may be heavy and/or warm.
- Comfortable with heights, extended periods of time sitting down, standing and walking throughout the Project area.

- An excellent understanding of Mi'kmaq environmental and cultural concerns
- Self-motivated and able to work independently
