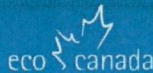

Ocean Training (Micro-Credentials)

Real-world ocean training provided through short, hands-on courses in *the following topics:*

Coastal Restoration & Blue Carbon	Coastal Planning & Climate Adaptation	Digital Tools & Mapping
Restore coastal areas & support climate solutions.	Understand erosion, flooding, and how to plan for change.	Use satellite images and mapping tools to monitor coastline & ocean environments.

Each course is 2-days long, totaling 6-days of training.
